Free School Meals

Some children are entitled to free meals at school. Please read on for further information.

From September 2014, all children in the infants (Reception, Year1 and Year 2) will automatically receive a free school meal. If you are entitled (see below for criteria) it is important that you complete a free school meal application form, as registering could mean extra government funding for our school.

Even if you don't want your child to receive a free meal, it is important to register so that the school gets as much money as possible. This extra money could go towards things like extra tuition, additional teaching assistants and after-school activities. Signing up for free school meals does not mean that your child must have a school meal five days a week. You can choose to provide a packed lunch on some days, if you prefer. Please advise the office on which days of the week they will be having a school meal.

How to apply

To sign up for free school meals, please see the school office for an application form.

Free school meals for Junior pupils

Free school meals are available for all school-aged children whose parent(s), carer(s) or guardian(s) receive one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit only (provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and your annual income does not exceed £16,190)



- Universal Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax
- Credit).

Harvest

Alternatively, if you know an elderly person in the Mickleover area (within short walking distance of school) whom you feel would appreciate a harvest gift from the school, please fill in the slip that your child brought home, return it to school and we will ensure that it is delivered to them at some point during the week of the 15th. Thank you for your support.

Inset days this year are on the following dates:



Who do I talk to?

If ever you have anything you are concerned about, regarding school, your child's class teacher is always the first port of call. As the children now come into school at 8.45am, unfortunately your child's class teacher won't be able to speak to you at this time of the day, although messages can always be passed onto them through the school office. The end of the day is always the best time to catch them - if you work, a quick phone call to the class teacher will enable you to arrange a mutually convenient time to meet.

There may be occasions when you would like to speak to Mrs Halliday (KS2 Assistant Headteacher), or Mrs Jones (KS1 Assistant Headteacher); again, a quick phone call to discuss your concern or make an appointment to come into school is best rather than trying to catch them at the beginning or end of the day.


As you know, I am always at the gate first thing in the morning and most afternoons and can pass messages / concerns on to relevant staff members, so come and chat to me.

Mrs Coyle, our Safeguarding and Inclusion Manager, is available to speak to if you feel your child is struggling at school eg due to family break-up, illness or bereavement. She can be contacted via the school office. If you feel your child has additional needs then Mrs Goozee is our SENDCO.

Whatever your concern, there is someone in school who can help you. If you don't feel that the issue is solved initially, please let us know so that we can try a different strategy. It's through working together that we will be able to keep your children happy and safe at school.

Private Access Road

Please could I ask parents who are waiting for their children at the end of the day, to wait on the school grounds rather than on the access road as I have had complaints from residents that they are not able to access their garages, get to their houses etc. At this time of day, the gates are shut, so you are able to wait on the car park.



Also, you may not be aware, but the road that many of you use for walking along to get into school, is not a public footpath but is a private access road, owned by the houses and not a public right of way. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Dropping off

Just a quick reminder that infant parents can say goodbye to their child by the reception classrooms, as for safeguarding reasons, we cannot allow parents across the playground at this time of day. Someone is always on hand to pass on a message to the class teacher if you need to get in touch first thing.

Bikes/scooters

It's great to see so many children cycling and scooting to school. (Please make sure bikes/scooters are named.) Just a reminder that within the school grounds, the children <u>must</u> walk their bikes and scooters; this also applies to the car park.

Home-school diaries

Please remember to sign the home-school diaries when you have listened to your child read. You can also use the diary for any notes or messages to the class teacher.

Parking

When dropping off and picking up your child from school, please try to avoid parking on the pavement or across residents' driveways.

Uniform

You can now buy our embroidered uniform from the "My Clothing" website. Please visit myclothing.com and choose our school. There is a link on our school website you can use. The school will receive cash back rewards for all uniform purchased.

If you have any uniform queries, the school brochure is available on the website or you can ask in the office. Here's a brief overview: grey trousers/skirt, white polo shirt/blouse, maroon sweatshirt/cardigan, white/black/grey socks/tights, black school shoes. Please name <u>all</u> uniform, shoes, coats, PE kits etc. As the weather becomes colder and wetter, you may wish your child to wear boots to and from school and at playtime/lunchtime. If this is the case, please send your child with their school shoes to change into when inside. Whilst jewellery and nail polish are not allowed, children may wear a watch and a pair of <u>small</u>, <u>plain</u> stud earrings if they wish. Please note that earrings <u>must not</u> be worn for PE. If your child is unable to remove their own earrings, please do this for them on PE days, before coming to school. We also ask that girls wear <u>plain clips/headbands</u> - no large flowers or bows.
