<p>Monday</p> <p>Standing up for what is right.</p>	<p>Introduction to this week.</p> <p>Pupils will be learning about World War 1 through stories, poems and artwork. Discuss the word conflict and what it means in the modern world or on the playground.</p> <p>Why did the war happen? Why did people fight? Protection. Standing up for others.</p> <p><b>EYFS and KS1:</b> How can you protect your friends when others are trying to hurt them?</p>

This could be based on poppies, or recounts from soldiers, nurses etc.</p> <p><b>EYFS and KS1:</b> Why do people wear poppies in November?</p> <p><b>OWN CLOTHES DAY Wear Red for Poppy Appeal and give a small donation- whatever you can spare for this important cause.</b></p> <p><b>National Roast Dinner Day for lunch.</b></p>
<p>Thursday</p> <p>How can we make peace?</p>	<p>PEACE assembly.</p> <p>Conflict resolution.</p> <p>How did WW1 come to an end?</p> <p>Why is it still so important to remember?</p> <p><b>EYFS and KS1:</b> How do we remember loved ones? How can we have a peaceful school?</p>
<p>Friday</p>  	<p><b>REAL TIME activities</b> a.m. ( Year 1 to Year 6)</p> <p>Pupils will get to work with children from different year groups to do a special activity of their choice (part of our mental health and wellbeing focus). <b>Children are invited to dress up as though from 1918 if they wish for the day or wear own clothes for Children in Need.</b></p> <p>In the afternoon we will be creating a '<b>Remembrance Book</b>' for <b>WW1 Centenary</b>. Children will be given the chance to visit our poppy remembrance garden with their class.</p> <p><b>Children in Need cake sale this afternoon. Please bring cakes to school in the morning for the sale and up to £2 to spend. We will sell any spare cakes at the end of the school day.</b></p>
