- **Review of previous meeting minutes**

Last minutes are from meeting in January as we did not have a meeting in second half of spring term ( half term too short, only four weeks).

Changes to yoghurt toppings. Feedback- Abdur Rahman said he doesn't like the strawberry sauce but the other toppings good. Pupils said that the apple crumble and yoghurt worked really well.

## Themed lunches

This year Mr Goodwin had not been informed that the teachers had decided to move the World Book Day celebrations to the last Friday of half term instead of the actual World Book Day.

- **St George's Day themed lunch yesterday was very popular.** Could we please think about the sausages used as not as nice as usual for the Lincolnshire sausage dish?

- **Food Council then had a look at the proposed summer menu**
- BBQ quorn kebabs ( marinade and serve)
- Ham and cheese quesadilla
- Club sandwiches- very popular. Ham and cheese in bread. Dipped in egg and fried.
- Carrot cake with lemon yoghurt topping.
- Quorn twister wrap ( like a chicken chilli wrap – chicken nuggets with lettuce).

- **National sandwich week competition to be linked to Sandwiches for the Royal Wedding Day Celebration at school.**

To run for yrs 2-6 from 26<sup>th</sup> April to 4<sup>th</sup> May.

Competition will run like last year- where the winner got to come in to make their sandwich with Mr Goodwin ready for it to be served to everyone at lunch.

Entries for the completion will be judged in class. Each class to vote for three finalists. Final winner to be decided by Mr Goodwin for the year group from the selection chosen by classes.

Winner announced on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> May.

- **Friday 25<sup>th</sup> May is now going to be the date for our Royal Wedding Day celebrations at MPS!**

We will have an Afternoon tea style as our celebration lunch. Royal Tea Party.

Tables and hall to be decorated. Children will make their selection of sandwich before the day so that Mr Goodwin knows how many of each filling need to be made and then we will have puddings based on things like Victoria sponge fairy cakes.

There will be five winning sandwiches on offer for the afternoon tea style celebration.

### **AOB for the new menu:**

Freya asked if we could have cream instead of custard to go with sponge puddings as sometimes the custard gets a skin on it by the time you get to your seat? Mr Goodwin explained that we have to think about the sugar content in cream and that is why we don't do this, but he will look into low sugar cream for the future. Also there is only one pudding option a week on the new menu that has custard, so this shouldn't be too much of a problem for this new round of meal choices.
