

End of Year Expectations: Reception

This booklet provides information for parents and carers on the end of year expectations for children in our school. The National Curriculum outlines these expectations as being the minimum requirements your child must meet each year. All the objectives will be worked on throughout the year and will be the focus of direct teaching. Any extra support you can provide in helping your children to achieve these is greatly valued.

If you have any queries regarding these expectations or would like support in knowing how best to help your child, please see the class teacher.

Reading

- Read some common irregular words.
- Use phonic knowledge to decide regular words & read them aloud accurately.
- Identify rhymes and join in with rhyming patterns.
- Read & understand simple sentences.
- Demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read.

Writing

- Write simple sentences which can be read by themselves & others.
- Start to use capital letters and full stops to demarcate sentences.
- Use correct pencil grip.
- Write name (correct upper & lower case).
- Use correct letter formation for familiar words.
- Write some irregular common words (eg he, the, was, no, go)
- Some words are spelt correctly and others are phonetically plausible.

Mathematics

- Recognise, write and count reliably to 20.
- Order numbers 1 − 20.
- Say 1 more/1 less to 20.
- Add & subtract two single digit numbers.
- Count on/back to find the answer.
- Solve problems, including doubling, halving and sharing.
- Use everyday language to talk about shape, size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money to compare quantities and objects.
- Recognise, create and describe patterns.
- Explore characteristics of objects and shapes and use mathematical language to describe them.
