Key Learning

Children will be able to:

- Say what bullying and cyberbullying are
- say how people should deal with cyberbullying
- understand why they should ask an adult if unsure
- identify warning signs that a website might not be secure
- identify personal information
- explain what to do if asked or told something online which makes them uncomfortable
- explain some of the dangers of revealing personal information to an online friend
- choose an appropriate action online to stay safe
- identify a situation they should be careful in online
- understand how a stereotype can be harmful

Safety knowledge

- Know how to be a good digital citizen
- Identify appropriate and inappropriate images and know that sharing images leaves me vulnerable
- Know that once an image is shared online you can lose control of it.
- It is illegal for a minor to send or receive an indecent image
- Know how to keep my online identity secure by not revealing personal information
- Tell an adult if I am a victim of cyber bullying or if something upsets me online; do not delete messages.
- Report to CEOP inappropriate behaviour on controlled sites
